Odells is an interesting pointer to the way Irish cuisine has developed in recent years. In between the staples of an Irish menu such as steak, chicken, pork and so on which a restaurant must offer in order to stay alive, the kitchen snatches influences from all over the world.

Pasta, perhaps fusilli with four cheeses, features as both primo and secondo plates. There is fillet of beef teriyaki, cajun chicken and beef satay. They have the nerve to serve lamb as rare as you request, and with whole cloves of garlic — not at all the Irish way to do it. For dessert, old favourites like banoffy pie are on offer alongside newcomers to town such as mud pie.

It may all sound like a recipe for getting hopelessly lost on a culinary trail around the globe, but they manage things with care, cook up a nifty wine list and look after you well.
